NRAM gravitated anew on responsible rice consumption with activities aimed at reducing rice wastage and supporting farmers. The "Half-Cup,

Full-Heart" challenge urged Filipinos dining out not to buy more than they can finish.

Branch stations breath life to the theme through various activities: Midsayap hosted "Roots and Shoots," involving staff and students in rice transplanting and plant care chores; Agusan promoted healthier rice alternatives during a two-day info drive among over 1,500 students; Los Baños ushered Grade 7 students into hands-on rice transplanting; while Batac, Bicol, Isabela, and Negros sponsored feeding programs, dance contests, quiz bee, and the distribution of PhilGAP-certified brown rice to students and farmers.





Collectively, the outcomes focused on boosting rice farming productivity, improving consumer access to affordable and nutritious rice, and ensuring a stable supply for a sustainable, prosperous rice farming communities. Discussions included implementing innovative farming technologies, enhancing the rice seed system, and linking farmers to markets, with a focus on climate-smart adaptations.
